Population¹

- Garden Grove is the 5th most populous city in Orange County: 170,883
- Garden Grove has the 4th greatest youth (0-17) population when compared to other OC cities: 43,763
- Ethnic breakdown: 22.6% White; 36.9% Hispanic; 36.9% Asian; 1.0% Black; 2.6% Other
- Median Family Income: \$62,820 ([Orange County: \$85,009] [U.S. Census Bureau: 2011 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates])

Social Services

- Garden Grove children receiving financial assistance through CalWORKs²: 3,572
 - Representing 7.69% of the 46,429 child recipients county-wide (12/1/2011)
- Child Abuse and neglect reports on children received from Garden Grove in 2013: 2,198
 - Representing 5.6% of the 39,594 reports received county-wide

Child Abuse and Neglect Report Details

- The majority of the 2,198 reports came from mandated professions (88%); Counselor/Therapist (30%), School Personnel/Teachers (25%), Other Professionals combined (20%), Law Enforcement (11%), and SSA, Probation, other Government Agency (16%). Non-mandated but concerned parties (including relatives) made 269 reports, equal to 12% of the total.
- The 2,198 report-allegations represent 1,618 distinct children³ in Garden Grove, by Gender & Age:

Extended Foster Care (EFC) Program: Non-Minor Dependents

- The EFC Program, created by Assembly Bill 12 in January, 2012, allows foster youth to receive foster care benefits and services after age 18 and up to age 21. These young adults remain under the jurisdiction of the court and supervision of the county as they transition to independence.
- There are 11 Non-Minor Dependents residing within the city of Garden Grove as of 12/31/2013

How can the Garden Grove Community help to Preserve and Reunite their Children and Families?

- Support community-based responses to protect children and preserve families
- Become a resource family and encourage others to do so (short or longer term foster care)
- Participate in team decision making meetings that bring together people to help children at risk
- Provide space for foster care orientation, training or family visitation
- Help with community mentoring for birth parents working towards reunification
